A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

This past Tuesday was a very significant day for our country. Not everyone in our world has the opportunity to elect their political leaders. After a very difficult political season, our country has chosen President-Elect Trump to lead us for the next four years. He will certainly have an extremely difficult job. Just because the election is over, it does not mean that our prayers, interest and involvement have to be over. In some ways, it is more important that we are involved now and for the next several years with our prayers and action. Our responsibility goes beyond just voting. May we do all in our power to strongly encourage that the decisions President-Elect Trump will make will first and foremost be decisions that respect all aspects of life. That includes the life of children in the womb. A child in the womb is the same child with the same heart, legs, brain, etc. as he or she is the day after birth--the same person. That includes the life of the poor who have a right to shelter, food, education and good health. That includes the life of the criminal who has violated us and is in prison and possibly on death row. It includes the life of immigrants of whom Pope Francis speaks over and over. It includes the life of those dying. It includes all life. The late Cardinal Bernardin of Chicago labeled this concept *The Seamless Garment*. This means that all life is given to us by God and we have the responsibility to protect and respect all life. We don't just pick and choose that some lives are important and that some lives are not important. It sees all life issues as part of a consistent priority reflecting compassion and justice. May we pray and may we use whatever influences and resources we have to make sure President Elect-Trump reflects this in all of his initiatives.

Included in the respect of all life is the care of our environment or what Pope Francis calls "The Care of Our Common Home." In order to help us understand what is involved in this responsibility and what the Pope says about it, we will have the opportunity during Advent to discuss and reflect on his encyclical, "Laudato Sí, mí Signore"-"Praise be to you, My Lord." We will meet on the Tuesdays during Advent, November 29, December 6, December 13, and December 20 from 7:00 PM until 8:30 PM. We will discuss things like climate change, global warming, what it means we have been given dominion over the earth, safe drinkable water, and what kind of world we want to leave to future generations, etc. If you are interested in joining us during these four weeks, please sign up in the back of the church in order that we can make the necessary preparations. As we prepare to celebrate that Jesus chose to make His home among us, may we become more reflective and informed of our responsibility to take "Care of Our Common Home."
