## A word from Fr. Bill....

#### Dear Parishioners:

This weekend is National Donor Sabbath Weekend. This is an opportunity for all of us to be educated and be reminded of the value of donating organs and tissues so that others may live and have a very good quality of life.

I think it is important for us specifically at St. Augustine Parish to be interested in this topic because the regional headquarters for transplants, Gift of Life, has two big facilities within our parish boundaries: their main office building at 3rd and Callowhill Sts. and the Family Life Guest House at 4th and Callowhill Sts. where a number of our parishioners provide two dinners a month for transplant patients and their families.

Since 1974, Gift of Life has worked to coordinate life-saving and life-enhancing transplants for those waiting, while supporting the generous donors and their families who have chosen to give others a second chance through organ donation. Gift of Life is a nonprofit organization serving the eastern half of Pennsylvania, southern New Jersey and Delaware and it operates right here within our parish boundaries.

In recent years, organ transplantation has helped to save more than 39,000 lives in our region. From death, new life has been made possible. There are still more than 5,900 people in our region awaiting life-saving organ transplants. Their hope for a second chance at life depends on the generosity of organ and tissue donors.

Please read the enclosed brochure for some very important information about myths as well as practical things concerning registration for transplants. For example, request for transplants is not contrary to the Catholic Faith. Pope Francis recently made these two statements: "Organ donation is a testimony of love of a neighbor" and "We need to encourage the donation of organs out of compassion." Request for transplants does not heed the work of medical personnel to save patients. Nor does a transplant interfere with wake or funeral arrangements. No one is too old to donate some organs or tissues.

It is estimated that 21 people die every day waiting for life-saving organs. Imagine all the lives which can be enhanced by donating an organ. It is not just the life of the recipient that is affected, but also the lives of the recipient's spouse, children, parents, siblings and other loved ones and friends as well.
