A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

The last several weeks have been incredible for our country. As we waited and waited and waited for the results of the presidential election, it was tense and it was also exciting because at the presidential level the result was razor thin. I think this experience can bring a sense of gratitude on our part, the need for our prayers and the need of our own personal recommitment to work for the common good.

We should be grateful that we live in a country where "we the people" are central in the democratic process. We are a very diverse country and the procedure which was handed down to us well over 200 years ago continues to work. It has been an emotional time for us as we have experienced democracy in action.

We should be grateful that we have men and women running for so many offices who want to serve us in very challenging and complicated times. We should be grateful that a record number of citizens participated in the process. We are very grateful for our innumerable fellow citizens from varied backgrounds of faith, race and political allegiances who worked tirelessly at the polls, counted the ballots and were involved in the overall process, many of whom were volunteers.

We now pray that President-elect Biden and all those, whether Republicans, Democrats or Independents, who have been elected to serve us in various ways will be aware that God is present with them and that they will be open to God's wisdom. We pray that they may be a source of healing and that they will be instrumental in a healing process which is so necessary in our country at this time. We are to fight the evils of our society: abortion, trafficking, racism, racial and sexual discrimination, capital punishment, euthanasia, indeed all evil.


