
Novena to the Santo Niño

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

A group of 6-8 of us met on eight Tuesday nights to discuss the Beatitudes. Pope Francis says in his "Exhortation on Holiness" that the Beatitudes are central on our journey to holiness since "the word 'happy' or 'blessed' becomes a synonym for holy." Please see below the reflections they had of the experience.

"I found the discussions thought provoking and inspirational. They gave me a lot of things to think about. They challenged me to see how I can incorporate some things into my life."

"They helped me to connect with people with different perspectives."

"The experience reminded me to keep God in my life more than just on Sundays."

"I really appreciated having someone who wasn't Catholic as part of the discussions."

"The discussions helped me to see that living the Beatitudes is doable--not just pious platitudes that are impossible to live."

"I remember someone telling me that living the Beatitudes was impossible. This experience helped me to ask myself how I can incorporate them in my life and make them realistic."

On Thursday, November 8th we had a meeting of 15 Parish Representatives who will be making the effort to contact to about 290 parishioners for our parish Capital Campaign. These are parishioners who have registered in the parish in the past two years and those who needed to be followed up from the first round of contacts. If you are contacted by one of our representatives, please be cooperative with his or her request to meet. They are providing a tremendous service to all of us. We now have just over \$572,000 pledged to the campaign, just over 76% of our goal of \$750,000. Last Saturday (November 10th) the members of our Parish Pastoral Council met all day and then were installed at the 5:15 PM Mass. Please see their picture on this bulletin cover. The purpose of the day was to get to know each other, discuss the purpose of a Parish Pastoral Council, and review our mission statement. Mr. Dan Cellucci, CEO of "The Catholic Leadership Institute" met with us and discussed a possible process for us during Lent to allow parishioners: 1) to reflect on their spiritual growth and discipleship, 2) to identify ways in which the parish effectively supports that growth and look at opportunities to support that growth more in the future and 3) to provide valuable input to help us make decisions and plan effectively.

The following are some of the reflections of those who participated in the day.

"It was a positive day because we spent time on what we can do to make the parish more enticing for people to come in and how we can grow together."

"It's important when we have these days and that we have someone like Dan (from Catholic Leadership Institute) as a central focus of the day. We got to know each other better. The real heart of today is this discussion about what we can do for the parish."

"We had a couple things into which we wanted to sink our teeth, including the mission statement."

"Hearing everyone's story and witness meant a lot--not just shaking hands. It is a foundation that will allow us to work together in a deeper way."

"I especially enjoyed getting to know other members of the council. It was nice to hear about the survey and that even though many Parishes don't want to do it, I feel very positive that we do."

"Today was a reminder that we belong to a special place. We are diverse, inclusive, and open minded enough to be critical about where we can get better. And it's clear that not every church community is blessed with that same attitude."

"This parish is our home. It is exciting to see how we might inspire others."

"I look forward to the survey. It is very promising."

"This is what I'm ordained to do. I get energized by it."

Last Sunday night, Dr. Sally Scholz, who has taught at Villanova for the past 25 years (see picture on cover) spoke to about 30 of us on the Church's position on war, or as she put it the Church's position on creating peace, a reflection of the Kingdom. The discussion was very well received.

Please know that I will be thinking of all of you and thanking God for you this Thursday, Thanksgiving Day. You will find within this bulletin some prayers, thoughts and suggestions which you might use with your family on Thanksgiving.

Prayers for the souls in Purgatory

All Souls Day is over— but the Church dedicates the month of November to prayer for the souls in Purgatory, and consideration of death: "In all you do, remember the end of your life, and then you will never sin" (Sirach 7:36). And all through November the Church grants special indulgences when we pray for the souls in Purgatory.

In fact, we ought to remember them throughout the year, as the Church does at every Mass.

To help us aid the poor souls, the Church has provided these beautiful indulgenced prayers for each day of the week.

Sunday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood, which Thy divine Son Jesus **shed in the Garden**, deliver the souls in purgatory, and especially that one which **is the most forsaken of all**, and bring it into Thy glory, where it may praise and bless Thee forever.

Monday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood, which Thy divine Son Jesus **shed in His cruel scourging**, deliver the souls in purgatory, and among them all especially that soul which is **nearest to its entrance into Thy glory**, that it may soon begin to praise Thee and bless Thee forever.

Tuesday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood of Thy divine Son Jesus that was **shed in His bitter crowning with thorns**, deliver the souls in purgatory, and among them all, particularly that soul which is **in the greatest need** of our prayers, in order that it may not long be delayed in praising Thee in Thy glory and blessing Thee forever.

Wednesday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood of Thy divine Son Jesus that was **shed in the streets of Jerusalem** while He carried on His sacred shoulders the heavy burden of the Cross, deliver the souls in purgatory and especially that one which is **richest in merits** in Thy sight, so that, having soon attained the high place in glory to which it is destined, it may praise Thee triumphantly and bless Thee forever.

Thursday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Body and Blood of Thy divine Son Jesus, which He Himself on the night before His Passion **gave as meat and drink to His beloved Apostles** and bequeathed to His Holy Church to be the perpetual Sacrifice and life-giving nourishment of His faithful people, deliver the souls in purgatory, but most of all, that soul which was **most devoted to this Mystery of infinite love**, in order that it may praise Thee therefore, together with Thy divine Son and the Holy Spirit in Thy glory forever.

Friday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood which Jesus Thy divine Son **shed this day upon the tree of the Cross**, especially from His sacred Hands and Feet, deliver the souls in purgatory, and particularly that soul for whom **I am most bound to pray**, in order that I may not be the cause which hinders Thee from admitting it quickly to the possession of Thy glory where it may praise Thee and bless Thee for evermore.

Saturday

O Lord God omnipotent, I beseech Thee by the Precious Blood which **gushed forth from the sacred Side** of Thy divine Son Jesus in the presence and to the great sorrow of His most holy Mother, deliver the souls in purgatory, and among them all especially that soul which has been **most devout to this noble Lady**, that it may come quickly into Thy glory, there to praise Thee in her, and her in Thee through all the ages.
