

### A word from Fr. Bill...

#### Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is the last Sunday of the liturgical/church year. As we all have celebrated the different aspects of Jesus' life this past year, may we all recommit ourselves to making Jesus the center of our lives. As Jesus directs us in the Gospel this Sunday, may we stay "awake" not just at the 2nd Coming but "awake" each day as he invites us each day to share in his life.

Please find in this bulletin an insert entitled, "Men of Heart." You will see the picture and some information of 20 men from the United States who are involved in various stages of Augustinian formation. Please put this flyer in a significant place in your home and pray for them regularly. Think and pray about other men you might invite to consider joining the Augustinian community.

As you very well know, Thursday is Thanksgiving. Many people would say that this is their favorite holiday of the year. One of the reasons for this is that families and friends get together without a great deal of "fanfare" to enjoy each other and to give thanks.

Before I share with you some of the things for which I will give thanks on Thursday, I would like to remind you that we will have Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 10:00 AM. Before we watch football games and eat turkey, it is appropriate to gather for the Eucharist which means thanksgiving. Secondly, you will find within this bulletin a prayer which I suggest you copy and use at your Thanksgiving meal.

On Thursday, I will give thanks to God for my Augustinian community, Fr. Paul, Fr. Jim K. and Fr. Jim P. They support me in my spiritual life and they support me as we live with the challenges of the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. We pray together, we recreate together, we live in community sharing our lives together. I am extremely grateful for their support as they assist me in the parish. Today, there are many diocesan pastors who are alone and sometimes they are pastors of 2 or 3 parishes. I am grateful that my Augustinian brothers support me in celebrating Masses, giving me an opportunity for a day off, to go on retreat and vacation.

I am grateful for our parish staff. I often say I could not do the job of any one of them. I don't know that much about technology. Thank you Jacob. I do not have any musical skills. Thank you Kim. I don't know the difference between a louver and façade. Thank you Tim. I can't cook or even know how to clean that well. Thank you Nancy and Robyn. Thank you Jean for your welcoming and hospitable spirit to the many couples who get married here.

I am grateful to the men and women on the Parish Pastoral Council who advise me monthly on the many aspects of the pastoral life of the parish and specifically right now helping to develop 3 pastoral goals for the next 3-5 years. I am grateful to our parishioners on the Parish Finance Commission who advise me monthly on the financial and administrative aspects of the parish. I give thanks to those who serve on the Steering Committee for the Capital Campaign. They have been instrumental in helping us in Phase One to reach 98.6 % of our goal of \$750,000 which in turn has helped us respond to many improvements on the parish property. Now in Phase Two, they are advising and giving support to reach out to foundations for grants.

I will give thanks on Thursday for the many among us who volunteer their services to the parish: in music, at Gift of Life, in RCIA, the spiritual education of children, in developing our Advent and Lenten programs, as liturgical ministers, cleaning the altar linens, and those who respond to specific requests as to help with cleaning the parish property (13 signed up to help for 11/19) and building sheds (a very generous parishioner who donated many hours).


Most importantly, I will thank God on Thursday for you, our parishioners, who share and witness your faith on a regular basis by celebrating the Eucharist with us each week.
