

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

As we celebrate the Feast of "Christ The King" this weekend, we come to the end of our liturgical year. Next weekend, we begin a new liturgical year as we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. Although our society would lead us to believe that it is now the Christmas Season, it is not. If we get into the thinking that it is time for Christmas decorations, trees or presents, we can very easily loose the significance of the Advent Season. Advent is really a twofold season. It is a time when we PREPARE to celebrate the first coming of Jesus, and at the same time, PREPARE for his second coming. In that sense, our whole life is an Advent.

The parish will have a number of resources to help us with this preparation:

- 1) In addition to the opportunity to celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** at 4:30 PM on Saturdays, confessions also will be heard after the 11:00 AM and 7:00 PM Masses on Sundays.
- 2) By participating in "The Giving Tree," there will be an opportunity to provide a Christmas gift(s) for someone who may not receive a gift. Please take a tag(s) from the tree, see for which agency it is, purchase the gift, <u>do not wrap</u> it, return it with the tag by <u>December 10th for the Adeodatus Prison Ministry and December 17th for ALL OTHER Groups.</u>

The agencies we are helping this year are Bethesda Project, Augustinian Children's Orphanage in Tagaytay City Philippines, Adeodatus Prison Ministry, Family House NOW, The Gift of Life Family House, and the Woman Of Hope. This year, we are happy to add a new group, the Franciscan Outreach Program, where we will be assisting 70 families this year providing clothing and a toy for each child.

- 3) Pick up the **pamphlet** entitled, "Christ Comes Anew." This will indicate for you the daily scripture readings at Mass for each day of Advent with a reflection on the reading and a thought provoking question for each day.
- **4)** Pick up a **second pamphlet** entitled, **"Watch for the Lord."** This can enhance your prayer life as you read each day a commentary on a scripture passage by Pope Francis, Mother Teresa, or Henry Noumen.
- 5) There will be an **insert in each bulletin of the four weekends of Advent entitled, "Awaiting His Presence."** The reflections on the Advent weekend readings will help us with specific points to ponder about the gifts of holiness, human life, one another, and the Lord. There also will be some suggested action steps, suggested family focus, and some educational pointers about the Advent Wreath, John the Baptist, and the "O" Antiphons, etc.
- 6) During Advent we should pray for the three members of our parish community who are preparing to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter. You will meet them in next weekend's bulletin and they will participate in the Rite of Acceptance at the 7:00 PM Mass next Sunday.
- 7) Hopefully, as many as possible will be able to join us on **Friday, December 7th at 7:30 PM** for one of the high lights of our parish year, our **pre-Christmas Concert** which this year is entitled, "All Earth is Hopeful." It is always fantastic and can help set the tone for Advent and help prepare us for Christmas. (*Please see the flyer insert in this bulletin for complete details.*)

Please take advantage of one, some or all of these resources during the next weeks, so that this truly will be a profitable Advent Season and not a season which gets lost in the hustle and bustle of our society.
