OSA Friends



WHY DO WE USE AN ADVENT WREATH?

Evergreen wreath—The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God (the Alpha and Omega). The evergreen is chosen as the base because God is the foundation of all good. Green is the colour that represents hope and new life.

Four Candles—represent the four (4) weeks of Advent. Traditionally, each week represents one thousand years, to sum to the 4,000 years from Adam and Eve until the birth of the Savior. The first two purple candles symbolizes **Hope** and **Love**, respectively. The third candle (which is pink/rose) symbolizes **Joy**. The fourth and last purple candle represents **Peace**. The light of the candles signifies the light of Christ to mankind. On Christmas, the center white



A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

Happy New Year! Happy New Liturgical/Church Year! Happy Advent!

As we begin a new Church year and enter into Advent, we have the great joy this Sunday at the 11 AM Mass of celebrating "The Rite of Welcoming" with our candidate, Ted Baker, in the RCIA (The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) process.

What is the RCIA? It is a process by which one enters a journey to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church.

What is a candidate? A candidate is one who was baptized in another Christian religion (as opposed to a Catechumen who has never been baptize) and is preparing to become Catholic).

What is the Rite of Welcoming? It is a ceremony where the faith community welcomes Ted and we pledge our prayers and support for him. Within the Rite, Ted will express his intention to follow the way of Christ and his sponsor, Ryan Langton, will assure the community of Ted's sincerely and his ongoing conversion.

Who is Ted Baker? Ted, who is 32 was baptized into the Church of Christ when he was 18 years old. He is originally from Syracuse, New York. He went to LeMoyne College in Syracuse where he met Kharisma Goldston. Kharisma is the director of Our Brothers Place, a shelter for men in Philadelphia. I witnessed their marriage here at St. Augustine's this past July 2nd. Ted is in the Army Reserves and works in the IT (Information Technology) department at the Philadelphia Naval Yard. For hobbies he likes to play video games and be involved in axe throwing. I told him to leave his axes at home. Ted called me last December after he witnessed this same ceremony on the First Sunday of Advent. He was inquiring what the process was to become Catholic. We stayed in touch over the next months due to his marriage preparation with Kharisma.

What has been involved in this process thus far? This past September Ted began the formal process of preparation, known as the "Period of Inquiry." Since then, we have met 10 times with Kharisma and his sponsor, Ryan Lawton. Ryan, a graduate of the University of Notre Dame, is currently preparing for his doctorate in Early American History at Temple University. Just as for the past eight years, Patrick Lanza meets with us each Monday evening, representing the parish. Some of the topics we have discussed since September are: What is Faith, the Holy Trinity, Who is Jesus, What is the Bible and how to use it, the Mass, the Church year, What are the different things in the church, Who makes up the Church and what are their different roles, as well as Mary, the Saints and our understanding of heaven, hell and purgatory.

Now What? Now that Ted has inquired about these topics, he is asking to formally be initiated into the next stage of the process. As I said, this Sunday morning at the 11 AM Mass Ted will publicly state his decision to move on in the process and the community will welcome him, thus the title, "The Rite of Welcoming." The next stage in the process is "The Period of Catechumenate" where we will focus on the Sacraments as well as Catholic beliefs, attitudes and practices.

Why does Ted want to become Catholic? Ted says he wants to become Catholic because he wants to be involved with the roots of Christianity. Also, marrying a Catholic woman and wanting to raise their children in the Catholic faith has motivated him.

As we begin Advent, may we keep Ted in prayer as he continues his journey of faith to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church when on April 16th, the Sunday after Easter, he will make a Profession of Faith to the Catholic Church, be confirmed and receive First Communion.
