

Dear Parishioners:

Happy New Year!

As you know, on the First Sunday of Advent we begin a new Liturgical Year. We begin once again to experience the various cycles of our faith. For the first two weekends of Advent we focus on preparing for the Second Coming of Jesus. The second two weekends we focus on preparing to celebrate the First Coming of Jesus. Our whole life is an advent preparing for Jesus' Second Coming, hopefully by developing a deeper relationship with Him, and having openness for how He is working in our lives.

We are providing several sources to help all of us do this. In the back of the church you will find two pamphlets. One provides the scripture readings for each day's Mass with a reflection. The second provides a scripture passage with a reflection each day from either Pope Francis or Henri Nouwen. Imagine spending Advent with Pope Francis and Henri Nouwen.

Each week you will find an insert in the bulletin with some information and reflection questions on that particular weekend. For example, this week we are directed to ask ourselves if Jesus were coming today, would He look at all our actions and say "Well done?" Is there anything we need to change in order to get that response?

Another thing to help us prepare for the Second Coming and to celebrate the First Coming is our "Giving Tree." You will see elsewhere within this bulletin the process for participating in that as well as who will be the recipients of your generosity.

At the end of Advent there will be another tree for families and individuals to decorate with ornaments which reflect their families or culture. This is a personal touch that will be a visible sign of our faith community here at St. Augustine's. We are doing this this year on the advice of the Parish Pastoral Council last year.
