This week (November 7-14) the Augustinian Friars of North America celebrate Augustinian Vocation Awareness Week. This is an opportunity to reflect on various things.

First of all, for those of us who are Augustinians, it is an opportunity to thank God for our vocation to live the Augustinian way of life. What does that mean? Our way of life is to live in community, which in and of itself has nothing to do with priesthood. These are two distinct vocations. We have vowed publicly to live in community in St. Augustine's concept of community. Some of us also have discerned a vocation to the priesthood.

You may be surprised to know that St. Augustine had no intention of finding a Religious Order in the same sense as did people like St. Dominic, St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Benedict, Mother Theresa and other founders and foundresses of Religious Communities. It was essential for Augustine to live in community with other men. He brought men together (and later women communities) to live "one mind and heart intent upon God......holding all things in common, calling nothing your own." It was very important for him to be with other men in prayer, supporting each other in all ways, where everyone's needs would be met according to their own individual situations, putting the common good above one's own individual good.

Augustine wrote his notion of community life in what is called "The Rule of St. Augustine." You will see Augustine depicted giving "The Rule" to the friars in the portrait in the choir loft on the parking lot side of the church closet to the back of the church.

Over the years after Augustine's death (430), many different people came together independently in various places to live his vision of community life. In 1256, 826 years after his death, the Church directed that all those living under the Rule of Augustine to come together as one Order. Thus, the formal beginning of the Augustinian Order.

The first place in the North America the Augustinians came to live in community is right here at St. Augustine Parish. As you know, 225 years later, there are four of us, Fr. Paul Morrissey, Fr. Jim Paradis, Fr. Jim Keating, and I who make up the local Augustinian community today. It is good for others to be aware of how we live our vocation as Augustinians. We pray together each morning (8:00 AM) and each evening (5:30 PM). We share our insights into the Sunday Gospel each Wednesday morning. We read a chapter of Augustine's "Rule" each Friday. We make it a priority to have dinner together, as much as we can, each evening. We have monthly "House Chapters" where we share how things are going in our lives and review various aspects of our community life. We have regular retreat days together. We try to have one social evening out together each month. None of us receives individual salaries. Any income we receive goes into one fund and from that comes our living expenses and monthly allowances.

On a personal note, I am extremely grateful for the men with whom I live in community. I am the only one officially assigned to the parish but as you know Fr. Paul, Fr. Jim K, and Fr. Jim P. are all very willing to help with the sacramental responsibilities of the parish. I am extremely grateful for their support.

So, during this Augustinian Awareness Vocation Week, we give thanks to God for our vocation to the Augustinian community. We give thanks to God for the countless Augustinians who have lived in community and served our parish in the past 225 years. We give thanks to God for our benefactors who support us, especially with our men in formation, and our men who are retired, and/or infirmed.



God may be using you to help that person be aware of his vocation to the Augustinians.


