

A word from Fr. Bill.....

Dear Parishioners:

Thanks to donations of close to \$7,000 from several parishioners in the past week, I am happy to inform you that we have received enough donations to cover the cost for the equipment for LiveStreaming our Masses. As I mentioned last week, the equipment cost approximately \$15,000 and we have received approximately \$15,000 in total donations. This is extremely important for several reasons. First and primary, it reflects the generosity of our parishioners.

Secondly, the purchase of this equipment was not budgeted but nor was the pandemic expected. This unbudgeted project became important in a challenging time to help us stay connected with you when we have had to be separated. A sincere thank you to all who made this happen.

At out Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meeting last week, we discussed which Masses should be LiveStreamed. After a very good conversation on the topic, it was advised to LiveStream the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass each week which we have been doing since April as well as the daily 12:05 PM Masses which we started doing this past week. Please go to the homepage of our parish website in order to connect to these Masses live or to watch a video recording of them at a later time.

In my letter last week, I mentioned that this past Tuesday was the 200th Anniversary of the death of Fr. Matthew Carr, OSA, the first pastor of our parish. To commemorate this day, we had a little prayer service on Tuesday after the 12:05 PM Mass. Next year, is the 225th Anniversary of when Father Carr came to the United States (1796) and more specifically to 4th and Vine Sts. and planted the seeds for the beginning of our parish.

At the PPC meeting last week, we discussed if we wanted to celebrate this important occasion in our parish. There was a very strong sentiment that we certainly should celebrate it. Hopefully, at the same time we might celebrate the end of the pandemic and find ways to come together physically as a parish community.

The next question was, how to celebrate. Without coming to any definite decisions, the Council suggested we look at the ways we celebrated the 220th anniversary, five years ago. They agreed we should indicate this special year with a banner on our parish property and a celebration banner on our parish bulletin and stationery. One member of the Council mentioned that the parish outing on the boat, The Spirit of Philadelphia, on the Delaware River was so popular five years ago that we should repeat it again. Another thought which surfaced was to ask the Philadelphia Orchestra to have a concert here. The reason for this is our parish is where the Orchestra began from our very own musicians in 1900. We discussed that because of the uncertainty of the pandemic, we should have both of these events in the later part of the year. It was also suggested that we have periodic service opportunities during the year. Of course, there was the suggestion of having a fundraiser. Guess who suggested that? We will ask the Parish Finance Commission to discuss this idea. As you can see, this was a very fruitful first discussion. Stay tuned for more to come. If anyone has any other suggestions or would like to become involved in the celebration of our 225th Anniversary, please be in touch with me.
