


Condo Outreach Ministry

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

This past Tuesday, I participated in a workshop sponsored by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia for the Ongoing Formation of Priests. It took place at St. Helena parish in Blue Bell. I would like to share some of the happenings of the day with you.

It began with a Holy Hour, including Benediction. The presider was Archbishop Pérez.

We heard a brief presentation by Sarah Hanley who is the President and CEO of the Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia. The purpose of this foundation is to help parishes raise funds. We have been involved with the foundation in two ways. They provided us with funds that helped purchase and install the equipment that allows us to livestream our Masses. Secondly, they are an essential part of the 2nd phase of our Capital Campaign. They helped us apply for several grants and presently they are putting together "a plan" for us to apply to a number of foundations for many of the physical needs of the parish which have to be addressed.

We heard a presentation concerning "The Synod" which had been called by Pope Francis. He will preside this Sunday in Rome at a Mass which will begin the Synod. What is the Synod? Each Diocese in the world is being asked to participate by providing means for listening and discernment by all of us on how we may walk together in new ways to proclaim the Gospel of Joy. You will be hearing more about this between now and next April. The input received from this process will be forwarded to the Conference of the United States Bishops and they in turn will forward a report to the Vatican which summarizes the reports of all the Dioceses in the United States. This then will be part of the agenda of the Synod which will take place in Rome. Stay tuned.

The main presentation of the day was presented by Dan Cellucci who is the CEO of The Catholic Leadership Institute. Dan is no stranger to St. Augustine Parish. He met in person with our Parish Pastoral Council a few years ago talking about how we might respond to the pastoral needs of our parish. Part of this process was a survey his institute facilitated for us. About 100 parishioners participated in this survey. After the survey was compiled, Dan met with the Pastoral Council to discuss its results. As a result of that survey, the Advent and Lenten programs we had last year evolved. The Archdiocese is initiating a process entitled "Called for More" which hopefully will help provide "A New Look at Thriving in Priestly Ministry." Part of this process will be to participate in the survey again. This time all the parishes in the Archdiocese will be involved in the survey at the same time. This hopefully will be a tool to get a sense of what parishioners are looking for and to get a sense for planning the future in parishes and in the Archdiocese. Why would we participate in the survey a second time? The answer is that the membership of our parish has changed over the last several years, some questions on the survey have changed, and we are in a different situation now due to the pandemic. In addition to getting a "snapshot" of parishes, another segment of "Called for More" will be to ascertain what are the gifts, interests, passions, preferences of the priests. The basic tenet of this process is the belief we are "All Called for More," but what is that "More" in the present time? You will be hearing a great deal more about this in the next year.

There was an opportunity for a conversation with Archbishop Pérez. This was an open question and answer session on any topic someone wanted to discuss with the Archbishop. He shared with us that he was very grateful, joyful and peaceful to return to his home Archbishop.

The last segment of the day was a report on some of the details of the move of St. Charles Seminary from Overbrook to the campus of Gwynedd Mercy University. The move has to be completed by 2024. There will be three phases to prepare for the seminary's new home. The first phase will begin this March/April with the construction of a new building.

I hope it is helpful for you to be aware of some of the happenings in the Archdiocese.
