

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

Remember a few weeks ago in my weekly letter, I thanked all those who made the August Sinulog such a success? I mentioned that one of the things (in addition to a new refrigerator in Carr Hall) we purchased from the proceeds of the Sinulog was an electric generator. It was bought primarily for the August Sinulog procession around the neighborhood. But, I also mentioned in my letter that it could be used for the parish in the case of an emergency. Little did I know how soon it would be put into use for that reason. From Wednesday evening, October 5 at 10:00 PM, until the next day, Thursday afternoon at 4:30 PM, we and 34 other local PECO customers were without electricity. I don't have to tell you how much we depend on electricity: the phones, the computers, refrigerators, freezers, regular lights (had to bring out the lanterns), the bells, etc. Thanks to the new generator and thanks to Rey Borres unpacking it, assembling it and connecting it to various appliances in the friary, we had electricity. All was well again. At least we could charge our cell phones and iPads. Priorities! First things first. Thank you to all who contributed to the Sinulog journal. This is one way your kindness helped the parish community. Thank you, Santo Nino!

As long as I am referring to previous letters in the bulletin, just a few weeks ago I encouraged you in my letter to visit and tour our parish website, **www.st-augustinechurch.com**. Well, now there is even another reason to do so. You will find on our homepage a drone video of our parish buildings from the air. This video was taken in the evening and has great shots (both close and at a distance) of the lit up clocks in the steeple. When this was taken, the lights were working fine. At a later time, the lights were not working. We received a grant from the McCarthy Foundation to repair them. When you see the lights in this video, I think you can see why it was so important to have them restored. Also, I encourage you to click onto the "Information" tab at the top of the homepage and scroll down to "Parish Fly-By Videos" and you will see four more drone videos, two of which were taken in the daytime. Although they are a little long (about 5 minutes each) they show great aerial views of our parish buildings and the surrounding area.

Talking about receiving grants, just to keep you up to date, the Steering Committee of the Parish Capital Campaign in collaboration with "The Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia," is in contact with a number of resources requesting grants: The Pennsylvania Historical Commission and Museum (for repairs to the steeple), the WSFS Bank (for a fire suppression sprinkling system in Carr Hall and Women of Hope and the handicap access to Carr Hall), the Koch Foundation (for egress doors, automatic doors and the fire alarm system in the church), WAWA (for repairs and upgrades to the kitchen in Carr Hall) and the Augustinian California Province (for matching funds for the PA Historic Commission). We have had encouraging conversations concerning grants with each of these resources. We continue the process. Also, the Steering Committee has been working very closely with an outside law firm and the Legal Department of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia to approve By-Laws for a separate 501(c)(3) status. This looks very positive. If and when it is approved, we can submit the request to the State of Pennsylvania and then to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) for its approval. Receiving this status will allow us to apply for grants from foundations which may not normally give to religious organizations.

As you can see, there are a lot of positive things in process and much of it looks very encouraging. Please keep those participating in this process in prayer.

These are just a few updates to keep you informed on some of the administrative things happening in the parish.
