
2021 Mass Book OPENING

A word from Fr. Bill....

In my letter last weekend, I suggested we go thru our drawers and closets and give away "slightly used" clothes which we do not use or need. As I said last week, St. Augustine says if we hoard what we do not use or need, we are stealing from the poor. Someone who read that last weekend (I was happy to see someone reads the bulletin) emailed and asked where they should drop off the clothes. You can bring the clothes to the Parish Office (M-F, 9AM-5 PM) and Jacob Marquart, O.F.S., our Director of Parish Services, will bring them to the Padre Pio Prayer Center in Frankford. It is staffed by the Capuchin Franciscan Friars who will distribute the clothes to the homeless in the Frankford and Kensington areas of Philadelphia.

Usually, once a year we have an extended Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meeting to be able to discuss some things more in depth than we can usually do at our monthly meetings. Last Saturday we met on Zoom for 2 1/2 hours. There are 12 people on the Council and 11 of us were present. One member had to attend a funeral. We also had Dan Cellucci who is the CEO of the *Catholic Leadership Institute* join us. He works with bishops, priest councils and parishes throughout the country (and further) to discuss the pastoral needs of the church today.

Dan facilitated a discussion for us on how we as a parish can respond to the pastoral needs of our parishioners in the middle of the pandemic. He shared with us what other parishes have found effective and some of his own insights. We reviewed what we are doing and talked about other possibilities. Stay tuned.

Each year I like to ask the PPC to review our Parish Mission Statement. This helps to remind us of who we say we are and what our mission is. After reviewing it this year, the Council suggested that we do not make any changes to it. I would ask you to read it. It is on the front page of this bulletin and on the homepage of our parish website. Some members of the Council said it was helpful to them when they were looking for a parish. It was felt there was not a need to change it because it is very welcoming ("open and diverse community"; "invite all"; "joyfully welcomes all") and it highlights the values of St. Augustine as he prayed to get to know himself better and to get to know God better. This is expanded on the "Becoming Catholic" section of our website where we are very specific of all who are welcome, e.g. all faiths, races, separated and divorced, members of the LGBTQ community, the homeless, visitors, those in recovery, widows and widowers, diverse cultures, etc.

Our 3rd topic was a discussion on the Saturday 5:15 PM Vigil Mass. It was recommended that at this time we suspend this Mass thru 2021 and revisit the topic next Fall. Various factors went into that recommendation: For a number of years the average attendance at that Mass has been about 35 people (including some visitors); It does not seem the pandemic will end in the near future; Many parishes do not provide evening Masses on both Saturday and Sundays; There is a need for weddings to be celebrated later on Saturday afternoons and up until now we have not been able to accommodate that need. So, at least until the end of 2021, we will not have a Saturday Vigil Mass at 5:15 PM.

In my letter last week and in the announcements, I asked who might be interested in joining a group on Zoom to discuss Pope Francis' new encyclical entitled: "Fratelli Tutti" (On Fraternity and Social Friendship) in which the Pope discusses how we as a society should respond to the wounds of our world. In addition to myself, five people signed up. As you can imagine, it was a challenge to find a common mutual time that would be convenient for the four of us but we did agree on Thursdays at 9 PM. So, if you're interested in joining us, please sign up in the back of church or be in touch with me at: pastorstaugustine@gmail.com. We will be meeting on Zoom on Thursdays at 9 PM. Feel free to mention this to others.
