A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

This week, I would like to share with your several unrelated "bits and pieces."

First of all, I inform you of the death of Joe Hoffman. For many years Joe was a part-time employee of our parish. For at least 20 years (6 pastors) Joe came to the parish one day a week to "do the books." He was an accountant by trade who provided a very valuable service to the parish. For about 25 years he also served as Assistant to the Treasurer of our Augustinian Province. Joe retired from the parish in 2015. He was 88 when he died last week. Along with our Provincial and Province Treasurer, I concelebrated his funeral Mass this past Monday. We thank God for his long time service to the parish and pray that he now is enjoying total peace with God.

A week ago Friday, our local Augustinian community (Fr. Paul, Fr. Jim K, Fr. Jim P and I) spent the day in what is called "A Chapter of Renewal." It is basically a retreat day where we look at all aspects of our community life together and affirm the good aspects and discuss where things might improve. We also discussed the topic of "Synodality," a concept I mentioned a few weeks ago. Pope Francis has called for a worldwide Synod, asking all Dioceses to consult with the people of the diocese. This process was formally opened in our Archdiocese last Sunday evening. At our day of renewal, we also discussed an article concerning compassion. It was a great day with some very valuable sharing.


As you will see elsewhere in this bulletin, we are looking for volunteers to help facilitate the parking at weddings. As you know, we have about 60-70 weddings a year here at the parish. As you can imagine, being in the city, having limited parking, having neighbors who pay for their parking spots, parking can be a challenge for us. We do have one parishioner who for several years has been volunteering his help with us when he can. In order to keep things going smoothly, we would like to have some more volunteers. If you are interested, please be in touch with me and I will connect you with our Wedding Coordinator, Jean Mangini. We are very fortunate that so many couples want to celebrate their Marriage in our church. It is an essential part of our parish life and it is obviously important for everyone that these celebrations go smoothly.

I have been asked to remind you that the City of Philadelphia has directed that face coverings be worn at inside activities during this period of the pandemic. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia strongly recommends it. We are grateful for your cooperation and concern for the health and comfort of yourself and of other parishioners. There are masks in the back of the church, if needed.

This past Tuesday night, Archbishop Perez presided at a ceremony at Villanova closing the Archdiocesan phase of the cause of beatification and canonization for our Augustinian brother, Fr. Bill Atkinson, OSA. In September 2015, Archbishop Chaput accepted the Order's request and agreed to do what he could to further the process. Then, at the November, 2015 Conference of the United States Bishops, the Bishops unanimously approved that this first phase of investigation could begin. After several years of intensive investigation (interviewing many people asking about the character, personality and values of Fr. Bill), this phase of the process has formally come to a conclusion. As a result of the investigation, it is recommended that the process continue in Rome. Fr. Bill experienced a life changing toboggan accident in February of 1965 which left him a quadriplegic. Because he lived a life of heroic virtue, it is believed he is a source of encouragement for people with similar kinds of accidents and disabilities in their lives. You can get an excellent summary of Bill's life in a 2 1/2 minute video which can be found on the bottom right side of the homepage of our parish website. There is an excellent book, Green Bananas, by Steve McWilliams which gives a great description of Bill's life. There also are certain prayers to pray to God thru the intercession of Servant of God, Father Bill Atkinson, OSA.
