Parish Committees







A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

In the Gospel this weekend, Bartimaeus, who is blind, tells Jesus he would like to see. How blind might we be to some of the needs of God's people? Do we pray that we would like Jesus to remove some of our blindness. Jesus is willing to do that but we have to be open to some of the resources he uses to help us "to see."

One resource we can take advantage of in order to help us "to see" is a workshop entitled, "Catholic Social Teaching: Jesus' Call and Our Response." It will take place on Saturday, November 17th from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM at St. Gabriel Parish Gym at 2917 Dickinson Street (19146) in Philadelphia.

The workshop will explore the Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching from an understanding of sacred scripture and the teachings of the Church Documents.
