

A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

Hopefully, you are aware of the Synod which has been taking place at the Vatican during this month of October. The first phase of the Synod began over a year ago when Pope Francis asked people from all over the world to gather in small groups and discuss how they experience the Church, how it has positively affected them and how could the Church do a better job of responding to the needs of our day. We had an opportunity last year to discuss these things one Sunday afternoon at St. Rita Shrine. Several of our parishioners took advantage of the invitation to participate in the session. Similar gatherings took place in other parishes, regions, Catholic high schools and colleges in the Archdiocese. A thorough summary of these discussions was compiled. This same process took place in every (Arch)diocese around the world. All the input from this year long process became the agenda for the second phase of the Synod which is taking place right now.

It was important for Pope Francis to hear from everyone. At the discussion tables at the Synod are bishops, cardinals, laymen, laywomen, including young people literally at the same table. There is a student from St. Joseph University participating as a voting member of the Synod. After the discussions are over this month, topics will be raised which all of us will have an opportunity to discuss next year. With the input from these discussions, the members will gather again next October. During those sessions some decisions will be made about the future of the Church. I find this exciting, as the Pope will hear from all sections of the Church and then give some direction for the future.

Many people have asked what is the purpose of this process. We have had Councils before but those participants were basically only Bishops and Cardinals, with some advisors who did not have any votes. The Pope said he wanted the Synod "to let some fresh air into the Church." He wanted to further implements the teachings of the Second Vatican Council. He wanted all members of the Church, not just Bishops and Cardinals, to be part of the process.

Topics being discussed this month include how the Church can be a sign and instrument of union with God and unity with humanity, how to share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel and what processes, structures and institutions create a missionary synodal church. Some of the specific things which have been discussed in the past two weeks included issues as synodality itself, the role of women in the church, welcome for LGBTQ Catholics, better education and formation of Catholics and more collaborative relationships between priests and laypeople. I am sure other issues will be raised and then next year we will all have the opportunity to share in discussions concerning these issues.

The Synod members are currently composing a "Letter to the People of God" to give a synthesis of their discussions in the past few weeks, and proposing "methods and steps" for continuing the synodal process in preparation for its next assembly in October 2024

Next October, the members will meet again and reflect on the input of the discussions in which all of us will have an opportunity to be involved in the next year and then will give some direction for the future of the Church.

May we continue to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to all those participating in this process.
