A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

Since the 3rd Sunday of Easter, April 26th, we have LiveStreamed 20 Masses, including the funeral for Lita Manguba. This has been very well received. It has been watched in Europe and in many places in the United States. This week, I received in the mail a donation for the parish from someone who is not a parishioner. In her letter she says, "I continue to watch your Mass each Sunday in LiveStream, and therefore am not able to make a donation in the normal manner. This is such a great service for the elderly or shut-ins. Not that I am elderly, but at this time I prefer to avoid large crowds due to the pandemic." I think this is the sentiment of many people.

We are extremely fortunate that Jacob Marquart, O.F.S., has literally been behind the camera for each of these 20 weeks. This has been an incredible service to the parish. Since the pandemic began, we have been making an effort to find ways to stay connected while we are apart and this has helped meet that need.

In consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council, we have purchased equipment to LiveStream our Masses automatically. It took approximately a week to install all the cables, a professional remote robotic camera, etc., by a very dedicated crew of workers. The installation is completed and the system is being fine-tuned by the company with whom we are contracted to help us with this endeavor. This is the last weekend Jacob will have to manually provide this service. Starting next weekend, we will be able to go public with automatically LiveStreaming our Masses. We certainly will be providing this service for the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass. As time goes on we will make decisions about the other Sunday Masses and weekday Masses. We intend to make this service available for weddings and funerals and perhaps baptisms. Many times family and friends are not able to attend these celebrations and they really appreciate being involved virtually. To view the 11:00 AM Mass next Sunday and then going forth, simply go to our parish website homepage at: www.st-augustinechurch.com and click on the link at the top of the page and you will be redirected to the LiveStreamed Mass at masslivestream.com. (Facebook will no longer be utilized for LiveStreaming.)

We have applied for a grant to subsidize the bulk for this equipment, installation, and training. We were told we would hear at the end of August or beginning of September about the result of this application. So, we should hear soon. We also have received donations to help with the cost. If anyone, would like to help, it would be greatly appreciated.

I am extremely grateful to Jacob, to those who installed the equipment, and to those who helped to finance it. This is a modern means of evangelization in general and specifically a means to help us stay connected during the pandemic and in the future.
