



A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

During the past weeks we have been making repetitive announcements about nominations to our Parish Pastoral Council, possible candidates to participate in the process of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), inviting parishioners to "sail" with us at a parish dinner cruise on The Spirit of Philadelphia on Friday, September 30th celebrating the 220th anniversary of our parish, and encouraging participation in the Sinulog. I would like to give you an update on each of these things.

I am very happy to inform you that three parishioners have accepted their nominations for a three-year term on the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). I am grateful for those who nominated them and I am especially grateful that these three parishioners have agreed to serve the parish in this capacity. I rely on the PPC for their advice and counsel on the pastoral aspects of our parish and for helping me to hear things about the parish which I might not normally hear. The three new members of the PPC are: Merilee Arevalo, Ed Riehl, and Dan Pedrongolo. Thank you Merilee, Ed, and Dan. I look forward to collaborating with you in the future.

Two parishioners have come forward requesting to receive the Sacraments of Initiation. Pierre Hannecart who has never been baptized will be a Catechumen, preparing to be baptized, confirmed and receive First Communion at the Easter Vigil on April 15th. Ignacio (Junior) Perez has been baptized and will be a Candidate. He will be preparing to be confirmed and receive First Communion the Sunday after Easter, April 23rd. I am grateful that Patrick Lanza will once again be joining us as a parish representative on Thursday nights for this process. Please keep Pierre and Junior in your prayers as they begin this extremely important journey of their lives.

As of last Tuesday, September 6th we had 129 paid registrants to sail with us on The Spirit of Philadelphia on Friday, September 30th. There are at least 2 others who have shown definite interest in joining us. We can take 150 people. If you are interested, please contact Jacob Marguart at the Parish Office.

As you know the celebration of the Sinulog on August 21st was a great success liturgically and socially. I am happy to inform you that it also was a success financially. I have been informed that the net profit to the parish was a little over \$3,500. This is the result of the advertisers in the Journal, donations of individuals and the sale of tee shirts. More importantly, it is the result of the tireless work of many. Obviously, the parish is very grateful for this contribution to help us balance our \$400,000 budget. We are indebted to everyone involved.

On another note, there is a group called "Grant Central USA" who has asked to use our premises on Tuesday and Wednesday, November 1 and 2 for a two-day workshop on grant writing. In exchange for using our property they are willing to allow two of our parishioners to participate in this workshop for free. Jacob Marquart is scheduled to be one our two participants. If you or you know someone who would like to participate in this two-day workshop on grant writing for free, please let me know. There would be the hope that this person would be able to use some of the acquired education and skills for the help of the parish in the future.

Finally, as you read this, I and seven of our parishioners will be on the parish pilgrimage to Paris and Rome. We return next Friday. Please keep us in prayer. We hope to be in attendance at the Pope's audience on Wednesday. Be very assured of my remembrances for our parish community at the audience with Pope Francis.
