Each Sunday, after the 11:00 AM Mass there is a novena in honor of the Santo Niño.



# A word from Fr. Bill....

#### Dear Parishioners:

Two weeks from Saturday Pope Francis will not only be in our country and in our city but he will be in our neighborhood. Very understandably, there has been a great deal of "hype" about the papal visit. Even in a city that has a many conventions and sporting events etc., the logistics for transportation, security, scheduling, liturgies and communications are unprecedented. May we be grateful to all those (Vatican Security, National Homeland Security, Secret Service, FBI, State Police, local police, officials of the city and the Archdiocese) who are involved with this challenging task.

It is absolutely fascinating that so many people are so anxious to see Pope Francis. This is certainly a sign of respect for his position as the Vicar of Christ. I believe it is a sign of his affable personality, the tone of his ministry to be inclusive, empathetic, and the desire to create an environment of acceptance and mercy.

I believe during his stay in the United States he will say some challenging things as he speaks to the joint session of Congress, the United Nations, seminarians, bishops, priests and religious, visit to an inner city school, a prison, Independence Hall, etc. No doubt he will speak about welcoming immigrants, taking care of the environment, the morality of war, the obligation to reach out to the poor and marginalized, the promotion of family life, the right to life of the unborn, the elderly, and the person on death row. He will challenge us to comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable. He will challenge us not to justify what is convenient for us but to live with Jesus as the center of our lives.

I pray that I and all of us will not just caught up in the "hype" but will truly hear what he says on these many issues and try to integrate this into our lives.

As a parish, we will have a lot of activity here that weekend. A group called Schoenstatt (a Marian movement founded in Germany emphasizing a strong devotion to the Blessed Mother) expects to have 100 to 300 members from around the world celebrating Mass here on Friday night about 6:30 PM and then using Carr Hall for a social. We expect about 15 college students from Boston thinking about the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Boston (I wish the Augustinians) and three priests to stay in Carr Hall on Friday and Saturday nights. About 54 people (43 students and 11 chaperones) from Everest Collegiate High School in Clarkston, MI will be celebrating Mass in the church on Saturday morning at 11:00 AM. We also want to be prepared for "drop in" visitors to the church. In addition, two bishops will be staying in the friary: Bishop Jamie Fuentes, bishop of Mina's Uruguay, and Bishop Alberto Bochatel, OSA, Auxiliary Bishop of La Plata, Argentina.

May this be a time of renewal, renewed appreciation, excitement and recommitment to the Church.
