A word from Fr. Bill

Dear Parishioners:

At the 11:00 AM Mass last Sunday we had the opportunity to thank Fr. Bill Donnelly, OSA (aka Fr. Bill, the elder) for his service as administrator of the parish from April, 2019 until April, 2020. It was a great opportunity for the parish in general and for me specifically to show our appreciation to him. It was very evident that Fr. Bill was grateful. As you can see below, parishioners wanted to take advantage of an opportunity to thank him and to have their picture taken with him.

You often have heard me say since the pandemic began last spring, that it is important for us to find ways to stay connected when we have to be separated. There are at least four ways we have been trying to do this.

One of the most obvious ways we have tried to do this is by livestreaming our Masses. This has been done manually since April 26th and beginning this weekend, we will be doing it automatically at the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass. Please see the homepage of our parish website for the link which is an easy connection.

The second and third ways we have been trying to do this is for the last five months some parishioners have been gathering every Tuesday at 8 PM to pray the rosary and every Thursday at 7 PM parishioners have been gathering to read and share insights into the following weekend's scripture passages. At both of these gatherings we have maybe 7 or 8 parishioners. It would be great to have more. Both meetings are on Zoom and the magic numbers to enter the Zoom rooms are on the front page of this bulletin on the bottom right hand corner. Please consider joining us and inviting others to do the same.

Considering fewer people are able to get to Mass during the pandemic and pick up the bulletin, the fourth way we have tried to stay more connected is by emailing this weekly letter directly to our parishioners.

Another way we have stayed connected over these months is by your faithfulness and generosity in financially supporting the parish. We are very grateful.

I am very sensitive as to how the pandemic will affect us in the future as a parish. I mentioned before that I have asked the Parish Pastoral Council to have a conversation about this. I also have asked representatives of the Filipino community to meet with me to discuss how this issue might affect the Filipino community. This is going to take place shortly on Zoom. I will keep you informed on what develops.
