## A Biographical Sketch of an Augustinian Saint....

Saint Alonso of Oropesa, Priest ◆ September 19th Alonso was born on October 17, 1500 in Oropesa, Toledo, Spain, to deeply Christian parents. When he was still young the family moved to the nearby city of Talavera de la Reina, where he received his schooling. At the age of 14 Alonso's parents sent him to the University of Salamanca where his brother Francisco was already a student. At the time, Thomas of Villanova was preaching in Salamanca and many were touched by his words, including a number of young people who were drawn to religious life. Among them were the two Orozco brothers, Francisco and Alonso, who entered the novitiate together in 1522 at the monastery of San Aqustin.

On June 9, 1523 Alonso made his profession, but his brother was unable to do so because of illness. He died shortly thereafter, making a deep impression on Alonso who began to suffer physical and spiritual afflictions that lasted for many years. All of these served to purify him, however, for he continued to live religious life with great fidelity. Following ordination he was assigned to preach and served, as well, as prior in various houses of his province. Later he volunteered to go as a missionary to Mexico but on the way he became ill and was ordered to return home. In 1554 he was named preacher of the royal court, but lived always as a simple friar, in absolute poverty and in the humblest of conditions. Ever attentive to the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, he became known as 'the saint of San Felipe'. Alonso

was also a prolific writer, publishing about 50 books, including a commentary on the Rule, works on Saint Augustine and the saints of the Order, and his own Confessions. Moved by a desire for reform within the Order, he founded several friaries and convents of contemplative nuns. He died on September 19, 1591. His body is venerated in the church of the Augustinian nuns of Madrid. Alonso was beatified by Leo XIII on January 15, 1882 and canonized on May 19, 2002 by John Paul II. Alonso is the newest Augustinian saint.

# A word from Fr. Bill....

#### Dear Parishioners:

First of all, I extend a sincere thank you to everyone who helped make Fr. Paul's celebration of his 50th anniversary of priesthood such a wonderful experience. Many people were involved in the liturgy and in the reception: the music at Mass, decorating and setting up Carr Hall, making arrangements with the caterer for the food, arranging the parking, cleaning up the hall. Many thanks to everyone. It was a great celebration.

As was announced in an insert in the bulletin last weekend, Mr. Rafat Hilal will be here this weekend selling olive wood religious works. Because we get many requests of this nature, I did not automatically just say "yes." When we received this request many months ago, I asked our Parish Pastoral Council for their advice if we should respond favorably to this request. They very much encouraged it. Weather permitting, Rafat will be in the patio area by the side door of the church.

I think the background information which was in the insert last weekend gives an excellent context of why we should be supportive of this effort.

"The tragic violence in the Middle East and the highly restrictive policies imposed on Palestinians has created severe economic instability for Palestinian Christians who live in the area of Bethlehem, a name which means "House of Bread."

"In the neighboring village of Beit-Sahour, from where the shepherds most likely came to be the first people to worship the Christ Child, Palestinian Christian families have carved exquisite olive wood religious works for generations. Current travel restrictions imposed on Palestine have dramatically reduced both pilgrimages and tourism. The livelihood of these Christian families is severely threatened.

"Mr. Rafat Hilal is part of a group of Palestinian Christians traveling around our country selling these superb carvings. The revenue generated helps to restore justice to an oppressed Palestinian Christian minority, supports over 300 families of skilled carvers and helps in keeping a Christian presence in the Holy Land.

"Rifat will display the carvings after the scheduled Masses. Your purchase, however small or big, will be an act of social justice as well as provide an opportunity to own or give as gifts original folk art from Bethlehem."

You might want to think of gifts you would like to give to someone or think of decorations you might want to have in your home this Christmas season and at the same time help our brother and sister Christians from the place where Jesus was born.
