Parish Committees





A word from Fr. Bill...

Dear Parishioners:

On Wednesday, September 7th about 10 to15 of us met on Zoom to reflect on this year's celebration of the Sinulog. The overwhelming consensus was that everything went extremely well. As one participant said "everything flowed nicely." This includes the parking (5 extra volunteers to direct the parking and parking available under the Ben Franklin Bridge), the food (ordered just the right amount of hoagies), the journal (the plan of deadlines helped tremendously), the liturgy (everything was beautiful, well prepared and greatly appreciative of Fr. Rob Hagan) and the procession (a very visible sign of our faith and community).

Naturally, there were a few areas which could be improved. They were minor, but duly noted and will be integrated next year. We agreed to meet on April 19th to begin to plan for next year's Sinulog which will be on August 20th. Bishop Timothy Senior, Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia, will preside at the Mass next year. Everyone knows that for something of this magnitude to go so smoothly it takes the cooperation of many, many people. We are extremely grateful to all of them.

It is estimated that the total net profit of this year's Sinulog was approximately \$4,000. This is mainly due to the income from the journal. The expenses include the printing of the journal, purchasing the food, giving stipends, obtaining city permits, etc.

From the profits of the Sinulog, the parish was able to purchase a new refrigerator and a new microwave oven for the kitchen in Carr Hall. The profits also enabled us to purchase a new electrical generator which will be helpful for the procession and also for the parish in general in the case of ever losing electricity. As the final tabulation of income and expenses is completed, other income will be used for the improvement of the kitchen in Carr Hall.

Speaking of Carr Hall, this past weekend was the first weekend since the pandemic began that we were able to have socials after the three Sunday Masses. They went very well. I heard at least three people say they wished their parish had these. It was an opportunity for people who just worshipped together to socialize with each other. For example, after the 7 pm Mass there were about 15 persons at the social (mostly all young and relatively new to the parish). Two of them who both come to the 7 pm Mass each Sunday discovered they both work at Villanova, one in fundraising and one as a chemistry professor. A new relationship began. Others met individuals they had seen but did not know. Others met new people they had never seen before.

It was agreed to continue the coffee and donuts after the 9 am Sunday Mass and the beer, wine and snacks after the 7 pm Sunday Mass.

What was agreed for the 11am Sunday Mass, is that we will have the traditional Filipino dinner on the first Sunday of each month. There will be coffee and donuts on the other three Sundays. Different parishioners agreed to oversee these other three weeks. In sensitivity to the pandemic, it was agreed that for the 11 am social, people will wear masks when they are in line for their food and that the food will be served to everyone. At the end of October, we will evaluate how this is working.

I am extremely grateful to Tim Babbage who was present at all three socials to make sure things got off to a smooth start, and they did.

We are looking for people who would be willing to help coordinate the socials. A few more volunteers would help reduce the work load of our present volunteers. If you are interested, please be in touch with me.

The Sinulog and the socials are both great signs of life within the community.
