

A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

After months and months of planning Pope Francis will visit us next weekend. It is wonderful to see all the excitement concerning his visit. Most people never would have the opportunity in their lifetime to see a pope. As Archbishop Chaput has encouraged us, I hope that most of us will be able to take advantage at sometime over the weekend to see the Pope.

We had over 150 parishioners submit their names for tickets for the Festival of Families on Saturday night and close to 190 parishioners submit their names for the Papal Mass on Sunday. After we began the lottery for the standing passes, we were informed by the Archdiocese that we would receive 5 seating passes for each of the two events. After consultation with several people, we decided instead of drawing 15 names (each to receive 2 standing passes), we would draw 17 names. The first two would receive 2 seating passes and the next 15 would receive the 30 standing passes. I have asked the Archdiocese for more passes. We were put on a waiting list for 30 more passes for each of the two events. If we receive them, we will draw more tickets. As we have announced, we will not have the 7:00 PM Mass next Sunday, September 27. Even though we realize many people will not be able to get here, we will have our three other regular weekend Masses: 5:15 PM on Saturday and 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM on Sunday morning.

Hopefully, you have seen the banners which are on the roof of the Friary welcoming Pope Francis. We are very grateful to Catalyst Outdoor, the company who facilitates the renting of our billboard. They have made it possible for us to have these banners as well to extend our welcome digitally on several of their digital billboards in the Philadelphia area. We are very grateful for the generosity, collaboration and cooperation of Catalyst Outdoor in this endeavor.

Hopefully, you have noticed that the garden area between the church and the parking lot has been "beautified." Ladybird Johnson would be proud. We were very fortunate to be one of the sites to which about 3,800 Villanovans (students, staff, faculty, and maintenance personnel) went to on Saturday, September 12th to provide service around the Philadelphia area. In addition to removing the gazebo (which very likely would not have survived another winter), they pruned the trees, cut the bushes, planted new plants and painted some railings.
