It has been recommended that as a parish we should volunteer at "Gift of Life." "Gift of Life" is just a few blocks away from our parish buildings. It is at 4th and Callowhill Sts. It is a kin to the Ronald McDonald Houses. Instead of children oriented, it is transplant oriented. It is a family home where transplant patients and their families can stay very inexpensively. It has a wonderful spirit and a wonderful environment. They are very dependent on volunteers. One of the volunteer opportunities is to provide and cook for a brunch (Saturday or Sunday)

or a dinner (any night). Volunteers would prepare a menu (maybe for 30-40 people), shop for the food (parish would pick up the cost), prepare the meal and put it out buffet style.

Depending on how many are interested in this parish outreach, we would see how often we as a parish would commit to providing a meal.

In order to ascertain the interest and also to provide more details, there will be a meeting in Carr Hall on Thursday, June 18th at 7:00 PM for all those who think they would be interested in being part of such a parish outreach. A word from Fr. Bill....

Dear Parishioners:

I believe one of the lessons of this weekend's Gospel is that it takes both God and humans for the Kingdom of God to come about. Speaking in ways that the people of His time could understand, Jesus is saying humans distribute the seed and we never know how God will allow that seed to take root and to grow. God uses us. God works through us. God blesses our work.

In that context, do you know anyone who might be interested in receiving the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and or Eucharist? It may just take your invitation to someone and then allowing God to do the rest.

I don't think we should be on the street corners twisting arms for people to become Catholic. That is an extreme. Another extreme is that we never mention it to anyone.

Sometimes we know someone who has shown interest in the Church. Maybe we know someone who was never baptized or was baptized in a Christian Faith other than Catholic and we have heard them say they were thinking of becoming Catholic. Maybe we know someone who was baptized Catholic but never received First Communion and or Confirmation. Maybe all that person needs is an invitation. That invitation cannot always come just from me or another priest. We do not have the contacts, opportunities and relationships which you have. You may be the only one who can offer that invitation. If you do not offer that invitation, maybe no one will.

This past Easter we had three young women, Angela, London and Becky, who received the Sacraments of Initiation. They each can point to the person, Karl, Chris, and Kevin, who had an influence on their decision. God uses us to plant the seeds.

If you know someone who might be interested in being part of the process of "The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults," please ask them to be in touch with me and I will explain the process to them. That person may not know how to get the information. God may be using you to plant the seed.
